



# LEADING WORSHIP TODAY

#### COVER ART curated by Rebecca Thornburgh

Pascal-Adolphe-Jean Dagnan-Bouveret, The Last Supper, 1896.

French painter Pascal-Adolphe-Jean Dagnan-Bouveret (1852-1929) was one of the leading members of the naturalist school. Born in Paris, he was raised by his grandfather after his father emigrated to Brazil, and he later added his grandfather's name, Bouveret, to his own. By the 1880s he was a leading modern artist with a studio in a fashionable Parisian neighborhood. Known for his scenes of peasant life in Brittany, he also painted mystical religious compositions, an example of which is this large-scale painting, exhibited at the Salon de Champ-de-Mars in 1896. Dagnan-Bouveret was one of the first painters to use the new medium of photography to bring greater realism to his work.

Classes will be offered for three different age groups:

- Children ages three to second grade will engage in faith formation through Godly Play curriculum.
- Children in grades three to five will increase their Bible literacy while learning about the richness of our Christian history and faith in a fun, structured setting. Our current curriculum is derived from the Memoria Press Christian Studies.
- Middle school youth in grades six to eight will study Follow Me: Biblical Practices for Faithful Living. Youth will explore how they can live out their faith, as Jesus taught, in our modern world. The middle school youth will meet during worship two to three times per month. On the remaining Sundays, youth should participate in the full worship service.

Most Sundays, we will begin Sunday School with a brief opening in the chapel.



# MOLLY LESTER AND MICHAEL BIXLER BUILDING GHOSTS: PAST LIVES AND LOST PLACES IN A CHANGING CITY

"Building ghosts" are the idiosyncratic remnants or imprints of demolished buildings, left behind on the sides of neighboring structures. Mostly seen in older Northeastern cities with rowhomes or party-wall adjacencies, they can reveal remarkable things, such as an old staircase going up the side of a building or plaster traces left by a set of shelves in an attic gable.

As history in our changing cities is erased and remade, these ghosts can be ephemeral or enduring.

They can be quickly revealed and replaced in a neighborhood seeing rapid change,

or unveiled and never re-covered in a neighborhood that has not seen new construction in a long time.


