Carl Moll, *Speisezimmer I (The Dining Table)*, 1915, oil on canvas. Carl Julius Rudolf Moll (1861–1945) was an Austrian Art Nouveau painter active in Vienna at the start of the 20th century. Recognized as one of the founders of the Vienna Secession, Moll was inspired by the pointillist techniques of French Impressionists. The aesthetic of a beautifully set table recurs frequently in his oeuvre—this motif allowed the painter to make good use of his technical skills in the treatment of details, as the reflections of the light on different textures and his foreshortening of perspective.

Classes will be offered for three different age groups:


NOVEMBER ART SHOW: Marlis Kraft Mixed Media Collage




