



William-Adolphe Bouguereau, *Charity* (or *The Indigent Family*), 1865, oil on canvas, Birmingham Museum and Art Gallery. *Charity* is traditionally represented as a mother with children, but in this version (one of several Bouguereau painted on this theme), the twist is that the mother and children are themselves in need of charity. A destitute family—a barefoot mother and her three young children—are huddled on the lower steps of a grand, classical style church (the Church of the Madeleine, Paris). Reminiscent of a Madonna, the mother turns a sorrowful gaze toward the viewer. The symmetry of the pyramidal composition and low viewpoint lend the group a sense of monumentality.

In his own time, Bouguereau (1825-1905) was considered to be one of the greatest painters in the world by the Academic art community, while simultaneously he was reviled by the avant garde. Bouguereau's career was a nearly straight up ascent with hardly a setback. To many, he epitomized taste and refinement, and a respect for tradition. To others, he was a competent technician stuck in the past. Degas and his Impressionist associates used *Bouguereaute* as a derogatory term for any artistic style reliant on "slick and artificial surfaces." Bouguereau's works were eagerly bought by wealthy American collectors who considered him the most important French artist of that time. But after 1920, Bouguereau fell into disrepute, due in part to changing tastes and partly to his staunch opposition to the Impressionists who were finally gaining acceptance. For decades following, his name was not even mentioned in encyclopedias.

Classes will be offered for three different age groups:

- Children ages three to second grade will engage in faith formation through Godly Play curriculum.
- Children in grades three to five will increase their Bible literacy while learning about the richness of our Christian history and faith in a fun, structured setting. We will be using the Memoria Press Christian Studies curriculum.
- Middle school youth in grades six to eight will study *Follow Me: Biblical Practices for Faithful Living.* Youth will explore how they can live out their faith, as Jesus taught, in our modern world. The middle school youth will meet during worship two to three times per month. On the remaining Sundays, youth should participate in the full worship service.

Most Sundays, we will begin Sunday School with a brief opening in the chapel.

On Sundays when Communion is served in worship, the children will return to sit with their families so that they can participate.

Below you will find a summary of the church's finances through December 31, 2024. Thank you to everyone who contributed financially to the life of our community in 2024. We were able to make up a significant gap in congregational giving at the end of the year and finish closer (though not all the way) to a balanced budget. Endowment draws are covering our deficit of \$32,844.

We are still in the process of developing the church budget for 2025. You can help us in this process by making a pledge if you have not done so already. Making and fulfilling a pledge allows you to be intentional in your financial commitment and provides critical information for church leadership as we plan our ministry for the year ahead. Pledges of any size are welcome and valued, and it is never too late to submit one. You can pick up a pledge card in the church office.


