



GOSPEL

On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come." MUSIC NOTES

Today's offertory anthem "MLK" was written by the band U2 in 1984 as a tribute to Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. This is one of two songs that the group dedicated to Dr. King, the other being "Pride (in the name of love)". These two songs earned U2's frontman Bono the highest honor from the King Center, a foundation founded by Coretta Scott King, the widow of Dr. King. The original version of "MLK" features just one singer over an instrumental drone. The arrangement sung today was created for another world-renowned group of a different genre, the male vocal group The King's Singers. The text is simple, and the song mimics a lullaby in its gentle melody, humming, and reference to sleep and dreams—a nod to Dr. King's iconic speech.

Frans Francken the Younger, *The Wedding at Cana*, c. 1618-20, oil on panel, Nationalmuseum, Stockholm. Born in Antwerp, Flemish painter Frans Francken the Younger (1581-1642) was the best-known and most prolific member of the large Francken family of artists. He painted large altarpieces for churches as well as smaller historical, mythological and allegorical scenes. His depictions of collectors' cabinets (or cabinets of curiosities) established a popular new genre of art in the era. Especially deft in painting the human figure, Francken often collaborated with other artists, adding figures and narrative elements to scenes created by painters specializing in landscape, architectural and floral still life paintings.

Classes will be offered for three different age groups:

- Children ages three to second grade will engage in faith formation through Godly Play curriculum.
- Children in grades three to five will increase their Bible literacy while learning about the richness of our Christian history and faith in a fun, structured setting. We will be using the Memoria Press Christian Studies curriculum.
- Middle school youth in grades six to eight will study *Follow Me: Biblical Practices for Faithful Living.* Youth will explore how they can live out their faith, as Jesus taught, in our modern world. The middle school youth will meet during worship two to three times per month. On the remaining Sundays, youth should participate in the full worship service.

Most Sundays, we will begin Sunday School with a brief opening in the chapel.

On Sundays when Communion is served in worship, the children will return to sit with their families so that they can participate.

We were able to make up a significant gap in congregational giving at the end of the year and finish closer (though not all the way) to a balanced budget. Endowment draws are covering our deficit of \$32,844.

We are still in the process of developing the church budget for 2025. You can help us in this process by making a pledge if you have not done so already. Making and fulfilling a pledge allows you to be intentional in your financial commitment and provides critical information for church leadership as we plan our ministry for the year ahead. Pledges of any size are welcome and valued, and it is never too late to submit one. You can pick up a pledge card in the church office.


