

Gyula Benczúr, Adoration of the Three Kings, 1911, oil on canvas. Hungarian painter and teacher Benczúr (1844–1920) specialized in portraits and historical scenes, and was known as an "outstanding exponent of academicism." He is considered one of the greatest Hungarian masters of historicism, an artistic approach that draws inspiration from recreating historic styles or imitating the work of historic artists and artisans. Benczúr's depiction of King Stephen's baptism won the Hungarian national competition for historical painting in 1870, bringing him international acclaim. In 1875, he was named Professor at Munich's Academy of Fine Arts and was an honorary member of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences. Following his death the northern Hungarian village of Dolány was named Benczúrfalva, and streets in twelve different cities are named for him. His daughters Olga (1875–1962) and Ida (1876–1970) also became well-known artists.

Classes will be offered for three different age groups:

- Children ages three to second grade will engage in faith formation through Godly Play curriculum.
- Children in grades three to five will increase their Bible literacy while learning about the richness of our Christian history and faith in a fun, structured setting. We will be using the Memoria Press Christian Studies curriculum.
- Middle school youth in grades six to eight will study Follow Me: Biblical Practices for Faithful Living. Youth will explore how they can live out their faith, as Jesus taught, in our modern world. The middle school youth will meet during worship two to three times per month. On the remaining Sundays, youth should participate in the full worship service.

Most Sundays, we will begin Sunday School with a brief opening in the chapel.

On Sundays when Communion is served in worship, the children will return to sit with their families so that they can participate.

INTRODUCTION TO TAI CHI FOR ARTHRITIS AND

Want to ease or reduce stiffness and pain associated with arthritis while improving your health, balance, and sense of wellbeing? Tai Chi for Arthritis and Falls Prevention (TCA) is an evidence-based program recommended by the CDC and the Arthritis Foundation. TCA is based on Sun style tai chi, a style chosen because of its healing component, its unique Qigong* elements (*an exercise which improves relaxation and vital energy), and its ability to improve mobility, confidence, and balance. We will learn an excellent set of warm-ups that you'll love doing daily, invigorating Qigong breathing exercises, and safe, flowing and soothing tai chi movements.

Session 1: January 14-February 18 (no class January 28), 1 p.m. or 2:15 p.m., \$72 (five weeks) Did you know that 1 in 2 women and 1 in 4 men over the age of 50 will have an osteoporosis related fracture in their remaining lifetime, and that osteoporosis is responsible for 1.5 million fractures a year in the United States? It doesn't have to be this way! Hundreds of clinical studies have indisputably proven that doing the right exercises, improving your balance, and making some lifestyle changes, are critical factors in building stronger bones. This one hour class will include standing and floor exercises to improve postural alignment, balance, and strength. 


