




Caspar David Friedrich, *Wanderer Above the Sea of Fog*, ca. 1818, oil on canvas, Hamburger Kunsthalle, Hamburg. Friedrich (1774-1840) was a German Romantic landscape painter, generally considered the most important German artist of his generation. Best known for his allegorical landscapes, which typically feature contemplative figures silhouetted against night skies, morning mists, barren trees or Gothic ruins, his often symbolic and anti-classical work seeks to convey a subjective, emotional response to the natural world. Considered to be one of the masterpieces of the Romantic movement, this painting has been interpreted as an emblem of self-reflection or contemplation of life's path, and the landscape is considered to evoke the sublime.


